Keeping this invariable truth in mind, Swāmījī did not approve giving his name and picture in this book, despite having been earnestly requested to do so. The truth that has expressed itself in the form of Swamiji’s words is verily self-effulgent. The name of this saint is not given in accordance with his principles. Because he is of the opinion that a system which is based on a particular name comes to an end eventually with the lapse of time; and it is quite natural to have attachment-aversion with the name. Therefore, it is better if no name is given along with the publication of the ecumenical truth. In addition, ideas/thoughts are the majesty of the Infinite; they are not personal qualities of a particular individual. Thus, the publication of the ideas takes place by virtue of the motiveless Grace of the Infinite. To associate the name of a particular person with it is inadvertence indeed.

Swāmījī did not want to publish, under his personal name, the universal system of thought that he had developed for the welfare of all of humanity in response to his inner grief. Those who are desirous of keeping the ego in check stay away from self-renown.

There was another important reason also. According to Swāmījī's viewpoint, to express the truth of life that is not dependent on any time, place, opinion, religion, tradition, and status through the medium of an individual is to diminish its value. Moreover, those who have not retained any existence apart from the reality of their Beloved—how can they say anything under their name.

The streams of knowledge and love used to flow spontaneously in his ego-free speech, hearing which great pundits used to say—and still say so—that the profound mysteries of philosophy that could not be comprehended by years of scriptural study have become clear in the discourses of this unlettered saint.
